Legislation provides regulations for the safe inspection, maintenance and operation of lifting equipment all around North America. Crane Safety courses really help crane managers and owners accredit their drivers in accordance with provincial legislation.

We have designed some training courses to be able to equip drivers with the knowledge and skills considered necessary to make crane lifting safer and easier. Operator training really helps to extend the life of cranes by guaranteeing crane's high performance and safe operation.

Accredited operators are required to operate and run articulated cranes under 16,000 lbs. capacity. The articulated crane operator has to have knowledge about the various operational features and characteristics of the machinery. Prior to use, a pre-operational machine check needs to be done. There is a legal prerequisite to carry out a pre-operational inspection as well as an inspection of the overhead conditions and work-site ground.

The manufacturer's directions provide information concerning maintenance and inspection, loading and unloading of the crane. The law requires annual and daily inspections. Operators should maintain an up-to-date logbook within most places. They may be needed to certify equipment warranties.

It is recommended that businesses add remote control devices to their cranes. Remote control enhances safety by enabling the driver an easier option for handling the crane.

Placing a high priority on crane safety helps a company's bottom line. Companies which follow safe machine practices generally enjoy bigger cost savings as opposed to those which don't. The risk of personal injury and equipment damage is really lessened when a driver who is well-trained is handling the crane. Safety conscious drivers are a lot more productive resulting in reduced times required for unloading and loading.
